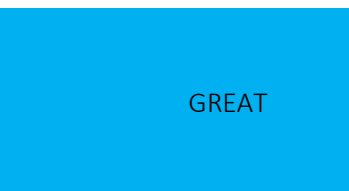
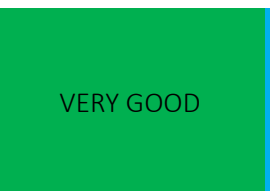
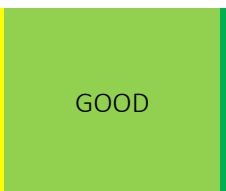

Candy Block	Dryandra	No	2	No	No	Interesting walks and great spring wildflowers (particularly Kwongan Walk in late spring)			
Lol Gray Lookout	Dryandra	1	1	No	No	Historic picnic area and challenging walk through typical Dryandra woodland			
Contine Hill	Campsite nearby	1	2	Yes	No	Scenic picnic area with BBQ and toilets at historic lookout. Attractive spring wildflowers.			
Dryandra main block	Lions Village Campsites	Yes		Yes	No	Best place to see native animals, particularly birds, numbats and endangered marsupials. Barna Mia night tour is a must.

Dryandra Woodland	Yes	click	Best place for birds and native animals. Barna Mia Nocturnal Animal Sanctuary tours: Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday (except for public holidays)
Newman Block	No	click	Beautiful spot this time of year. The Sandplain walk has great wildflowers now, but access best for 4WD or robust 2WD vehicles.
